

Mathematics

The children will enhance their mathematical understanding of number by practising a range of ways to add and subtract, represent numbers and using their knowledge to problem solve. We will explore a range of 2D and 3D shapes by using real-life objects that relate to our own experiences.

The children will also experiment with data analysis by finding ways of how we can present information on a graph relating to our topic of homes.

Music

The children will take part in weekly key stage music sessions where they will explore pitch and timbre with percussion instruments. They will take inspiration from listening to music which was made during the 1950s, after World War 2. The children will also perform individually or in a group.

Forest School

Exploring the area.
Looking at seasonal changes.

Geography

Where do I live? Learning my address and what type of house I live in.
Looking at areas of the world which experience natural disasters.
Finding out about how buildings withstand natural disasters.

Science

Exploring materials and their properties. What materials can be bent, squashed and squeezed? What materials would be good to create a waterproof membrane?
What materials can we find in our local area?
We will be looking at how to work scientifically and how to conduct a fair test.

English

Spelling/Phonics/Grammar:

Daily letters and sounds lessons.
Learning how to use sentences with different forms: statements, questions, commands, exclamations.

Handwriting:

Development of a neat, cursive script.

Reading

The children will do group reading where they will enjoy, discuss and analyse text together. They will also participate in individual reading to an adult. The children will all read independently after lunch. They can read books from school or bring in books from home. The class will enjoy a class novel read to them by the teacher.

Writing

The children will have the opportunity to write creatively in a variety of forms and also learn the skills needed for technical writing.
