What is needed in school?

PE kits every day
Reading Records and books every day

Spelling books in on a Thursday

Owl Class: Swimming kit or forest school clothes on Friday (alternate weeks).

What can we do at home?

Daily reading, phonics and tricky words revision (resources provided).

Practise the weeks spellings. The spelling test will be on a Thursday. There will also be a weekly homework task for you to have a go at, which will be set on a Monday.

English

Spelling/Phonics/Grammar:

Daily letters and sounds lessons.

Learning how to use sentences with different forms: statements, questions, commands, exclamations.

Learning spelling rules and the children will have a weekly spelling test on a Thursday.

Daily Handwriting:

Development of a neat, cursive script.

Reading

The children will do group reading where they will enjoy, discuss and analyse a text together. They will also participate in individual reading to an adult. The children will all read independently after lunch. They can read a book from school or bring in one from home. The class will enjoy a class novel.

Writing

The children will have the opportunity to write creatively in a variety of forms and also learn the skills needed for technical writing.

History
