Geography

First half term:

Group Reading and Whole Class Texts:

Information texts: Create an information text on a superhero, using subheadings and captions.

Narrative: Write an adventure story with heroes and villains.

Daily Handwriting:

Development of a neat, cursive script.

Daily letters and sounds lessons.
