Mathematics

We will be learning the names and properties of different shapes, learning about place value in numbers, and developing our skills in addition and subtraction including solving problems.

Year 2 will also be learning about money, recognising coins and notes and solving addition and subtraction problems with money. Year 2 will also learn about multiplication including learning their 2, 5 and 10 times tables and looking at

division by sharing in to equal groups.

Who is Muslim and how do they live? We will be continuing our learning about Islam.

Art

We will look at the Pop-Art work of artists Roy Lichtenstein and Andy Warhol. We will look at comic artwork, choice of colour and bold outlines. We will design and make our own popart explosion word linking to our theme of Super Heroes and our vocabulary exploration in English.

Music

The children will take part in weekly key stage music sessions where they will explore rhythm with drums and other percussion instruments. They will take inspiration from listening to music from different parts of the world. The children will learn songs and sing in parts and rounds, keeping a beat or rhythms in time with others. also perform individually or in a group.

Geography

We will be looking at amazing places around the world. Discovering different climates and how people and animals have adapted to survive them. We will learn the name of continents and locate them on globes and maps. We will create our own maps with a key of symbols.

Science - 'We are super animals!'

We will be learning that there are different animal types. We will discover what is different about them and how we are also amazing animals. We will learn about all the amazing things our bodies can do – inside and out. We will learn to name the different parts of our bodies and what they do. We will look at how we can stay healthy and what super foods can do for us.

What is needed in school?

Reading book, reading record, named water bottles and a coat, should be brought in to school every day. Forest School – Bring wellies and waterproofs.

What can you do to help at home?

Read every day! We expect that reading books will be read through three times and when your child can read it fluently, they are ready for a new book. You can also read them stories and they can log in to Bug Club and read one of their allocated books or check out the tasks on the inside cover of your reading book. Practise your phonics with flashcards every day.

Learn your 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

Practise your handwriting as this makes a big difference.

English

We are really excited to be taking part in this years Bookfest. All year 1 and 2 children will be working towards writing and producing their own book which will then be entered into a competition. We will have workshops with a real author as we look at her books. Children will be reading a lot of stories, discovering how characters are created, learning story language and picking up new vocabulary. We will be learning about sentence structure and story patterns. Children will also be learning grammar, punctuation and spelling of common 'exception' words that will help support their writing. Children will have daily Phonics sessions where they will be learning to read and write the many sounds we use in our written language.

We will be reading daily so please do have your reading books in school every day.

Computing

Using computer programs such as 'I learn' to create a comic strip narrative in the Pop Art style.

PSHE

We will be looking at Superheroes and their roles. What jobs do people have that help to keep people safe? How can we keep safe?

Outdoor Adventures

Children will experience using a hand drill with conkers. We will make clay faces and explore how to camouflage.
